What happened to CHU on 7.335 MHz?

Although not as common as it used to be, in the US most hams know and use WWV for time checks. But many older ham transceivers do not receive 2.5, 5, 10, 15 or 20 MHz. For those older rigs Canada's CHU has always been there on 7.335 MHz, but no more. After 70 years CHU has moved to 7850. The move occurred on January 1. Sadly many older transceivers now can not receive a time and frequency station. The move was required when in April 2007 the ITU reallocated the 7300 to 7350 band to international broadcasting. Interference from broadcasters required the move. I, for one, will miss them..

OK Get Ready for a Biggie - Desecheo

One of the most wanted DX countries will be on the air February 12 through the 26th as K5D. Desecheo is about #2 or #7 on the most wanted lists depending on who's doing the listing. And we couldn't be better located to work them. Desecheo Island is an island just off the coast of Puerto Rico. Access is tightly controlled by the US Fish and Wildlife Services, plus the island is used for target practice by the military. Lots of unexploded ordinance around. Desecheo gets activated perhaps every 10 to 20 years, so get it this time or you'll have a long wait. They will be active on 160-meters to 6-meters. ***Did I mention 6-meters?*** With only minimally good conditions we can hit them on 6-meters. Don't miss it. If you don't have 6-meter capability the 40-meter beam at W4NC does a fairly good job on six. We could operate from the Red Cross a night or three if there is interest.

Edwin Felts Jr.

FELTS STATESVILLE - Mr. Edwin Reese Felts, Jr., 78, of 705 Alexander St., Statesville, passed away Tuesday, Jan. 20, 2009 at Forsyth Regional Medical Center in Winston-Salem, NC. Born Feb. 24, 1930 in Virginia to the late E.R. Felts, Sr. and Margaret Keister Felts of Roanoke, VA. He served in the U.S. Airforce during the Korean War and retired from WSJS channel 12 as a TV Producer and TV Personality. Funeral grave side services will be conducted at Evergreen Burial Park in Roanoke, VA at a later date. A memorial service in Statesville will be announced at a later date. Nicholson Funeral Home of Statesville is serving the family of Edwin Reese Felts, Jr.

Reese was a Life Member of FARC and made a major donation to the club in 1989 that enabled some major improvements, notably the upgrade to the 146.64 repeater (which coincided with the change on the repeater to callsign W4NC) and the generator that is still in the Chapter House garage today.
